Victoria is where one of Australia's most vibrant and active cities, Melbourne, is located.

Victoria is located on Australia's south east coast and is a short plane ride to Sydney, Queensland and the Great Barrier Reef, or even New Zealand.

Melbourne and Victoria's weather is slightly cooler than that in the rest of Australia. It also snows in some parts of the state so you can pack your skis or snowboard, along with your surfboard.

It is just 90 minutes away from the Melbourne CBD and offers a laid-back lifestyle, with a huge range of outdoor and cultural opportunities to experience. Western Australia is the biggest state in Australia in terms of size and, while there is a lot of space, the majority of people live on the South West coast.

A trip south of Perth is a must do for anyone coming to the state. Internationally acclaimed wineries, beaches and forests are all within a day's drive south. Travelling north usually involves a plane trip, which is well worth the effort, with some of the most undisturbed scenery, historical regions and wildlife on offer.

While Western Australia and Perth are known to be isolated, they are actually very close to the South East Asian region with Bali and Indonesia a short plane trip away.




